



George Fricker


1950

George was a four year letter winner in basketball and was captain as a senior. He was a regular for three years, and scored 763 points on teams that had a combined record of 42-19. George went on to be a member of the 1950-51 University of MN basketball team, and is the only Nordic to ever play Division I basketball.

George served in the US Army from 1952 to 1955. He graduated from the University of MN in 1958, and received a Juris Doctor of Law Degree in 1962 from William Mitchell College of Law. He was Staff Attorney under Attorney General Robert Kennedy in Washington, D.C. from 1962-64. He worked private practice thereafter until retiring. He is married to Avis Nelson from Lake Bronson, MN. They have two children.



Van is married to Dede Jarshaw, also a Newfolden graduate. They have two sons.








Marlin Bjornrud


Jill Graduated from UND in 1987 with a degree in Physical Therapy. She has been in private practice in Flint, MI since 1999. She is married and has three sons.


Jodi Foss



Wendel was a three-sport athlete in high school. Following graduation he attended north Central Bible College. Wendel worked in Minneapolis, was a bus mechanic for the Newfolden School District, and owned and operated a shop in Sturgeon Lake.

In 2010, Wendel returned to Newfolden. He renovated and reopened his dad's old shop. Wendel and his wife, Sandra, have three children and thirteen grandchildren.

August played football and basketball before leaving high school for the Navy after his junior year. He spent a total of twenty-two years in the Navy as well as seven years in the Army Reserve. Dave Haug Soph. Forward



Lloyd Hjelle Soph. Forward



Wayne Dahl Junior Student Manager




in a game pleved at Roseau.





Newfolden Nordics Capture Crown In District 32 Basketball Tourney

The Nordics now enter Region 8 play against the powerful Bemidji Lumberjacks at 7 p. m. Tuesday. March 10 at the University of North Dakota Fieldhouse in Grand Forks. The Nordics had a 16-2 season record, a 1-2 record in Sub-District Tourney play and a 3-O record in District Tourney play for an overall record of 20-4.

The Nordies wound up the season of 24 games scoring 1,374 points to the opposition's 1127 points. This is a game average of 57.2 points per game for the Nordies and 46.9 for the opposition. The Nordies scored 513 field goals for an average of 21.2 field goals per game which holding the opposition to 458 field goals or an average of 19 per game. The Nordies scored 354 free throws for an average of 14.7 per game while the opposition made 209 for an average of 8.5 per game. The Nordies committed 296 fouls for an average of 12.3 fouls per game while the opposition fouled 405 times for an average of 16.8 per game.
